Thanks to more than 500 inputs received during **stakeholders'** and **public consultations** in spring and summer, a greener and smarter programme is in the making.





Changing the Alpine Space for the better

Interreg Alpine Space projects continued improving the quality of life for Alpine citizens. In 2020, seven projects ended and changed the programme area for the better:

CaSCo unveiled the potential of low carbon timber products through improvements in public procurement practices. +++ **GREENCYCLE** introduced a circular economy system to the Alpine Space to achieve low-carbon targets. +++ **SMART-SPACE** strengthened the innovation capacity of manufacturing SMEs by using digital technologies. +++ **AlpInnoCT** tackled the main challenges in freight trafficking and raised the combined transport efficiency and productivity. +++ **Des-Alps** developed tools to increase the use of design thinking in supporting SME's innovation. +++ **CARE4TECH** transformed the Alpine Space research, tech- and innovation scene into a stable EU leading knowledge area and built cross-sectoral alliances for smart living. +++ **Links4Soils** developed a common framework to promote and foster sustainable management of Alpine soils.

Promoting project results: Final campaign & Output library

The Interreg Alpine Space programme 2014-20 has funded 64 transnational cooperation projects, of which 36 are still running at the end of 2020. By the end of the year, a total sum of \in 72,9 mio. has been paid to the projects, involving more than 600 project partners. **Links4Soils** was one of the projects promoted in the final campaign, disseminating valuable knowledge on Alpine soils across the Alps.

Projects in the spotlight

PlurAlps was featured in the publication 'Interreg responses to migration challenges'. It was one of 18 Interreg-financed projects that successfully tackled migration challenges and demonstrated the great value of pluralistic societies. ATLAS and AlpES were featured on the TV news channel Euronews. The video report showed how European Cohesion Policy projects improve the quality of life across the EU, for instance by restoring historical buildings (ATLAS) and protecting the services provided by natural ecosystems (AlpES). On 15 October, we organized the workshop "Let's Make Green Europe Happen!" as part of the EU Week of Regions and Cities. The Alpine Space projects GREENCYCLE, CaSCo and AlpBioEco took the opportunity and shared their experiences and results for a greener Europe.
