The Interreg Alpine Space programme is a European cooperation programme. It finances cooperation projects across the borders of seven Alpine countries via the European Regional Development Fund (ERDF). The programme fosters sustainable economic development, societal wellbeing and the preservation of the outstanding nature of the Alps. It brings together public authorities, academia, business and civil society organisations to tackle common challenges and improve the quality of life of the 80 million inhabitants of the Alpine region.

Priorities

Based on the framework provided by the EU regulation, the Interreg Alpine Space programme 2021-2027 defines the following priorities:

Priority 1

Climate resilient and green Alpine region

The strong effects of climate change challenge inter-relations within natural, economic, and societal systems. Moreover, pressure is high on the rich Alpine biodiversity. This particular context calls for urgent action.



Priority 2

Carbon neutral and resource sensitive Alpine region

The European Union aims at becoming the first climate-neutral continent by 2050. To reach the targets, the efforts must be increased in the next years. The ambition and the potential of the Alpine region are high.
